## The Ultimate Disposition of Space Junk

- Isaiah 66:22 mentions "the new heavens and the New Earth, which I [the LORD] will make."

Regarding space junk and the various interstellar probes that have been sent beyond the reaches of our solar system, this is something I've thought about from time to time. Of course, we have no direct inspired indication as to what the disposition of these things will be, but I think it is safe to assume the junk orbiting the earth will be vaporized by the brightness of Christ's coming. That would be important when we are "caught up to meet the Lord in the air," because I am sure we will not need to worry about dodging any of this space junk as we ascend to heaven!

Regarding space probes, including those that have landed on the moon, Venus, Mars, Titan, and various asteroids, there would need to be a more deliberate clean-up effort. Presumably that would happen sometime during the millennium but how that would happen and whether we would have a part in it is impossible to say until that time arrives.

I found this man's answer to be quite logical and satisfying. After all, if "the Lord shall consume with the spirit of His Mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of His coming" (2 Thess. 2:8) all the wicked beings, including Satan, then the inanimate objects they have fashioned must also cease to exist.
