It is understood that the term *prophet* comprehends those named by the Spirit of Inspiration as prophesying at any time, whether only temporarily or in more or less permanently functioning by divine calling. The term *prophecy* does not necessarily include predictions of the future, though the prophetic office does imply the ability to speak for God. As such, the importance of discerning between false and true prophets was and is of paramount importance. One excellent yardstick is: “If they speak not according to this Word, it is because there is no light in them” (Isa. 8:20). Another is our Saviour’s counsel: “By their fruits ye shall know them” (Mt. 7:20).
